	Children explore the settings and themes, writing a retelling of the story from the main character's point of view and sharing their thoughts and opinions about the story. The same text is then used to draw out the process and lifecycle of growing plants. Children use this as a starting point to create a lifecycle flow diagram, charting the changes that take place as a plant grows and what is needed to nurture it in order to give guidance on how to look after plants.
